First Aid & Medication	<p>Staff Pupils Others</p>	<p>First Aiders must always wear gloves when administering first aid procedures. It is advisable a face covering is worn if having to deliver close contact first aid. (always refer to up to date information from Gov.UK) Any dressings used to be double bagged. Where any medications are administered try and encourage the pupils to self-administer or consider wearing a face covering (always refer to up to date information from Gov.UK)</p>	L

		<p>Gov.co.uk NHS DfE Department for Health and Social Care</p> <p>The relevant staff receive any necessary training that helps minimise the spread of infection, e.g. infection control training. (washing of hands, cleaning up bodily fluids)</p> <p>Staff are made aware of the school's infection control procedures in relation to coronavirus via email or staff meetings and contact the school as soon as possible if they believe they may have been exposed to coronavirus.</p> <p>Parents are made aware of the school's infection control procedures in relation to coronavirus via letter, posters or social media – they are informed that they must contact the school as soon as possible if they believe their child has been exposed to coronavirus.</p> <p>Pupils are made aware of the school's infection control procedures in relation to coronavirus via school staff and are informed that they must tell a member of staff if they feel unwell.</p>			
Poor hygiene practice	<p>Staff Pupils Others</p>	<p>Posters are displayed throughout the school reminding pupils, staff and visitors to wash their hands, e.g. before entering and leaving the school.</p> <p>Pupils, staff and visitors are encouraged to wash their hands with soap or alcohol-based sanitiser (that contains no less than 60% alcohol) and follow infection control procedures in accordance with the DfE and PHE's</p>	L		

		<p>guidance.</p> <p>Sufficient amounts of soap (or hand sanitiser where applicable), clean water and paper towels/hand dryers are supplied in all toilets and kitchen areas.</p> <p>Pupils may be supervised by staff when washing their hands to ensure it is carried out correctly, where necessary.</p> <p>Pupils are forbidden from sharing cutlery, cups or food.</p> <p>All cutlery and cups are thoroughly cleaned before and after use.</p> <p>Cleaners to carry out daily, comprehensive cleaning that follows national guidance and is compliant with the COSHH Policy and the Health and Safety Policy.</p> <p>A senior member of staff arranges enhanced cleaning to be undertaken where required – advice about enhanced cleaning protocols is sought from the Health Protection Team /Public Health England</p>			
Ill health	<p>Staff</p> <p>Pupils</p> <p>Others</p>	<p>Staff are informed of the symptoms of possible coronavirus infection, e.g. a cough, difficulty in breathing and high temperature, and are kept up to date with national guidance about the signs, symptoms and transmission of coronavirus.</p> <p>Any pupil or member of staff who displays signs of being unwell, such as having a cough, fever or difficulty in breathing, and believes they have been exposed to coronavirus, is immediately taken out of the class and placed in an area</p>	L		

		<p>where they will not come into contact with others and are supervised at all times. The relevant member of staff calls for emergency assistance immediately if pupils' symptoms worsen.</p> <p>The parents of unwell pupils are informed as soon as possible of the situation by a relevant member of staff.</p> <p>Where contact with a pupil's parents cannot be made, appropriate procedures are followed in accordance with those outlined in governmental guidance.</p> <p>Unwell pupils who are waiting to go home are kept in an area where they can be at least two metres away from others.</p> <p>Areas used by unwell staff and pupils who need to go home are appropriately cleaned once vacated, using a disinfectant and care to be taken when cleaning all hard surfaces.</p> <p>If unwell pupils and staff are waiting to go home, they are instructed to use different toilets to the rest of the school to minimise the spread of infection.</p> <p>Any pupils who display signs of infection are taken home immediately, or as soon as practicable, by their parents – the parents are advised to contact NHS 111 immediately or call 999 if the pupil becomes seriously ill or their life is at risk.</p> <p>Any members of staff who display signs of infection are sent home immediately and are advised to contact NHS 111 immediately or call</p>			
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		<p>999 if they become seriously ill or their life is at risk.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>If Staff become symptomatic of COVID-19, they must inform the HT who will then 'close' that bubble. The members of that bubble will remain off site. If a negative test result is returned then the bubble will reopen the next working day. If a positive result is returned, all members of that bubble will need to isolate for 14days from the date of the confirmed case (08.06.2020).</li> </ul> <p>Any medication given to ease the unwell individual's symptoms, e.g. Paracetamol, is administered in accordance with the Administering Medications Policy.</p>			
Spread of infection	Staff Pupils Others	<p>Spillages of bodily fluids, e.g. respiratory and nasal discharges, are cleaned up immediately in line with guidance, using PPE at all times. Parents are informed not to bring their children to school or on the school premises if they show signs of being unwell and believe they have been exposed to coronavirus.</p> <p>Staff and pupils do not return to school before the minimum recommended exclusion period (or the 'self-isolation' period) has passed, in line with national guidance.</p> <p>Pupils who are unwell are not taken on school trips or permitted to enter public areas used for teaching, e.g. swimming pools.</p> <p>Parents notify the school if their child has an</p>	L		

		<p>impaired immune system or a medical condition that means they are vulnerable to infections. The school in liaison with individuals' medical professionals where necessary, reviews the needs of pupils who are vulnerable to infections. Any additional provisions for pupils who are vulnerable to infections are put in place by the headteacher, in liaison with the pupil's parents where necessary.</p>			
Poor management of infectious diseases	<p>Staff Pupils Others</p>	<p>Everyone is instructed to monitor themselves and others and look out for similar symptoms if a pupil or staff member has been sent home with suspected coronavirus. Staff are vigilant and report concerns about their own, a colleague's or a pupil's symptoms to the Headteacher or SLT as soon as possible. . The school is consistent in its approach to the management of suspected and confirmed cases of coronavirus. The school is informed by pupils' parents when pupils return to school after having coronavirus – the school informs the relevant staff. Staff inform the headteacher when they plan to return to work after having coronavirus. A nominated person monitors the cleaning standards of school cleaning contractors and discusses any additional measures required with regards to managing the spread of coronavirus.</p>	L		
Lack of communication	<p>Pupils Staff Parents</p>	<p>The school staff reports immediately to the headteacher about any cases of suspected coronavirus, even if they are unsure.</p>	L		

	Others	The headteacher contacts the local HPT or follows the advice given from and discusses if any further action needs to be taken. Schools put into place any actions or precautions advised by their local HPT. Schools keep staff, pupils and parents adequately updated about any changes to infection control procedures as necessary.			
Cleaning while school open	Staff	All hard surfaces to be cleaned on a regular basis, this will include All door handles All tables and chairs used by staff and pupils Toilet flushes and regular cleaning of toilets. All classrooms to have spray disinfectant and where possible disposable cloths. If disposable cloths are not available use once and then put in wash. Regular cleaning of surfaces will reduce the risk of spreading the virus. All used cloths thrown away to be double bagged and then placed in a secure area i.e. lockable bin.	L

Contractors in school	Staff Pupils	Where contractors are coming into school they must have up to date Risk Assessments and Method Statements. Control measures regarding the Coronavirus must be included within their RAMs. School to ensure no pupils or staff are in the	L		

		<p>area where contractors are working. Contractors will be designated a toilet they can use whilst on site. Contractors will be responsible for removing all rubbish they have created and to clean their area of work prior to leaving. They must ensure no workers are displaying any signs or symptoms of Coronavirus prior to entering the school site. If they become aware of a contractor coming down with symptoms within 14 days of being at the school they must inform the school immediately.</p>			
Emergencies	Staff Pupils	<p>All staff and children' emergency contact details are up-to-date, including alternative emergency contact details, where required. Children' parents are contacted as soon as practicable in the event of an emergency. Staff and children' alternative contacts are contacted where their primary emergency contact cannot be contacted.</p>	L
